

# Light of the World

## A song for Christmas

Originally a too-late entry for a 2014 carol competition, **Light of the World** remained under wraps until composer/conductor **Robin White** had the chance to record it in 2020, with his own **Alban Voices** and the **Royal Ballet Sinfonia**.

“What can you say about Christmas that’s new?” asks Robin. “Nothing: that’s the whole point! Christmas is always what we expect it to be: certainly since Victorian times, and before – OK, it was more rough-and-ready, but the message has always been the same. And yet for every child growing up it can be a wonderful new experience, and even for us adults: yes, we’ve seen and heard it all before, but sometimes we may discover a new slant on the familiar story”.

“For this setting, I’ve chosen one of my favourite idioms: the Viennese waltz. Perhaps more associated with New Year, and the wonderful concert from Vienna’s Musikverein that we’re now able to enjoy all over the world, still as an expression of sheer joy the waltz is hard to beat”.

**Robin White** trained at Imperial College, London and the Royal College of Music. He has conducted open-air, pop-classics concerts at National Trust and other venues across the south-west of England and the midlands. He has also worked with leading soloists such as John Lill, Christopher Warren-Green, Alexander Baillie and Emma Johnson in concerts in Bristol and the Channel Islands.

As an arranger, his work has been recorded and broadcast on Radio 2 and Classic FM, and played live in Melbourne by the Australian Pops Orchestra.

**Alban Voices** is a small, ad-hoc choir formed over 20 years ago by Robin White and his late wife, Freda. Originally a relief choir for services in St. Albans Abbey, it has since performed at other venues, and featured most notably in a pivotal episode of the BBC TV soap opera **EastEnders** in December 2003.

**Royal Ballet Sinfonia** is the orchestra which accompanies Birmingham Royal Ballet on its extensive tours, in the UK and elsewhere. Recently it has been increasingly in demand as a recording orchestra, particularly featuring the work of British and/or living composers.
