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HackPolitik is an investigation, through music and dance, of how we engage politics through technology in the 21st century. The ballet follows the rise and fall of hackers Topiary, Kayla, and Sabu (among other collaborators and adversaries), while exploring the thin line between activism and anarchy, anonymity and ego, gender identity and personality. All of the choreography is a physical interpretation of documented events as they occurred in cyberspace.

Peter Van Zandt Lane (b. 1985) is a Boston-based composer of instrumental and electroacoustic music. His works have been critically praised for their "appeal to musicians and audiences, no matter their personal musical aesthetic" (Asymmetry Music Magazine). HackPolitik, was hailed as "angular, jarring, and sophisticated . . . very compelling . . . ballet needs live music, and this one offered it at the highest level." (Boston Musical Intelligencer). Peter has received fellowships from Yaddo, MacDowell Colony, and the Virginia Center for the Creative Arts, The Atlantic Center for the Creative Arts, and has received commissions from the Barlow Endowment, the Wellesley Composers Conference, and Dinosaur Annex Music Ensemble, among others. His music has been played by top-tier ensembles such as the Cleveland Orchestra, International Contemporary Ensemble, the New York Virtuoso Singers, and the Lydian String Quartet. Peter holds degrees from Brandeis University and the University of Miami. He studied composition with Melinda Wagner, Eric Chasalow, and David Rakowski.

Dubbed a five time "Classical Music Pick" by the Boston Globe, Juventas New Music Ensemble voices the musical culture of the present by featuring repertoire of living, emerging composers. Based in Boston, Massachusetts, the ensemble has seven core musicians augmented with guest artists to form a wide array of instrumentations—both traditional and non-traditional. Juventas presents new operas, ballet, and compositions concert music for chamber ensemble. Since its founding in 2005, Juventas has performed works of over 150 composers in exhilarating concerts that showcase the diversity of contemporary music. Recent productions have received The American Prize for Best Professional Opera Production (2012) and the National Opera Association Award for Best Professional Production (2011, 2012).
