Niels Rosing-Schow (b. 1954) crafts chamber music of sensual, organic allure, rich with contrast and sonic elegance. This album unveils four works – from the vibrant *Dance and Signs in the Air* to the soulful *Respiro ergo sum* – crowned by his exquisite take on Debussy's *Six épigraphes antiques*. Through kinetic archetypes and seamless musical arcs, Rosing-Schow shapes an immediate, evocative voice, timeless yet fresh, speaking vividly on music's own terms.

THIS IS THE STORY

- Niels Rosing-Schow's music is characterised by refined and fascinating sounds. It is **sensual**, **organic and rich** in contrasts.
- This album presents four works which all embody these qualities and display the same distinctive sonic refinement.
- Rosing-Schow's ambition is to communicate directly, ensuring that also listeners withour deep musical knowledge can engage.
- Dance and Signs in the Air was inspired by experiences in Shanghai. Here he creates subtle references to **Chinese music** with quartertones that break the 'classical' atmosphere
- Granito y arco iris is chamber concerto for accordion, performed by the virtuoso Bjarke Mogensen. The work draws from the conceptual pairing of granite and rainbow – two contrastiong natural phenomena representing the concrete and the abstract.
- Finally, Rosing-Schow has created an instrumental arrangement of **Debussy's Six épigraphes antiques**, originally composed for piano four hands. Its structure, mood and content are poetic, marked by the elegance and sensuality that define Debussy's style.
