



# TransAtlantic Ensemble's superb musicianship combined with their comfortable and cool stage presence makes them a joy to behold.

We have a love for Latin music and culture, and strive to continually explore those styles that sit well in both a classical and crossover concert. Miguel del Águila has a beautiful sense of melody that immediately summons the mood he wants, and he writes with impetuous development that takes the listener on an emotional journey. D'Rivera is a master of rhythm, theme, and development that reflects his Latin mentors and favorite styles, while adding a humor all his own. The newest bandeónist to dominate the international scene, JP Jofre's compositions offer a contemporary Argentinian Tango style that hits home in its narration. "Havana Moon" would not be complete without the reverent moments from the 1920's classical Brazilian piano music of Heitor Villa-Lobos.

### **Mariam Adam**

Born in Monterey, California to an Egyptian father and a Mexican mother, Mariam Adam lives between New York and Paris. Each of these influences has shaped her musicianship and collaborations worldwide. She has collaborated with renowned classical and jazz musicians from Yo-Yo Ma to Wayne Shorter, and has performed in prestigious venues and series around the world. She has appeared as soloist alongside the Sacramento Symphony, the Monterey Symphony, the Appassionata Ensemble in France, and the Singapore National Youth Symphony.

A founding member of the Grammy-nominated woodwind quintet, Imani Winds, Adam has maintained an active international touring schedule for over 15 years. The quintet is a pillar in the classical music community, unparalleled in bringing the wind quintet to higher levels of recognition through virtuosity, style, repertoire, and engaging programs. In 2010 she started the AdZel Duo with clarinetist Stephanie Zelnick performing works celebrating their combined heritage from the Middle East. Their music covers the conflicting yet homogenous cultures through special commissions and master classes on an international scale.

Adam recorded 7 albums with Imani Winds before the group was signed by EMI for their exciting wind quintet version of the Rite of Spring which was selected in 2013's Best of iTunes. She can also be heard on Chick Corea's The Continents, Wayne Shorter's "Without a Net", Steve Coleman's "Ascension to Light" and Mohammed Fairouz's "Native Informant."

# **Evelyn Ulex**

Hailed as "charismatic" with "beautifully clean piano lines" and "firm, rounded keyboard tone," pianist Evelyn Ulex was born and raised in Berlin, Germany and makes her home in both Berlin and New York. Her performance career has taken her across Europe, North, and South America, and she has appeared with the Deutsche Staatsoper, Philharmonie, and Konzerthaus in Berlin as well as the Philharmonie Gdańsk. She has recently played prominent venues around New York City and in festivals across the United States.

At the age of ten, Ulex won the national "Festival of Young Talent" in Dresden, later taking top awards in the J.S. Bach competition in Leipzig and Finalist of the Schumann Competition. She was a Finalist in the Frienna Awerbuch International Piano Competition in New York City, which laid down the cornerstone of her careers in both the United States and Europe.

An active chamber musician who continues to explore many varied musical genres, Ms. Ulex has collaborated on a number of special projects such as "Sight & Sound," a live multimedia concert featuring projections of paintings by Berlin artist Ade Frey. The projected images supplement Ulex's performances of Mussorgky's *Pictures at an Exhibition*, Schumann, and Villa Lobos. She has also collaborated with Brazilian soprano Katia Guedes. The result is the new album *The Brazilian Classical Song*, which spans over 200 years of classical Brazilian repertoire.

In addition to their strong presence in Europe, this duo has toured extensively throughout the continental US performing at such distinguished halls as Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, Symphony Space and Le Poisson Rouge. TransAtlantic Ensemble also remains dedicated to their music community, extensive Master Class offerings held at Universities and Festivals across the country including Juilliard, New School and the Imani Winds Festival.
