

### Randy Boothe, Artistic Director

Randy Boothe became director of the BYU Young Ambassadors in 1977. He also directed for Walt Disney Productions, Jackson Hole Playhouse, and Hawaii's Polynesian Cultural Center. Boothe's productions have taken him around the globe with live and televised appearances in over 43 countries, and his musical presentations have been performed for royalty and government officials, as well as for children in hospitals and orphanages. During the 2002 Olympic Winter Games, Boothe directed *Light of the World* with a cast of 1,500 for audiences numbering more than 300,000.

### Eric Hansen, Band Director

Eric Hansen's work with the BYU Young Ambassadors began in 1981 when he played bass in the group's live band. Now he is the group's music producer and show band director. An alumnus of Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University, Hansen has turned his education into a thriving career, performing with companies such as the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, the Musik Barock Ensemble, the Baltimore Opera Orchestra, and the National Chamber Ensemble in Washington, DC. Hansen's career as a recitalist has taken him to venues in the United States, Canada, Austria, China. and Poland.

## CREATING THE ALBUM

**2011** the BYU Young Ambassadors' show-development team, composed of Randy Boothe, Eric Hansen, Janielle Christensen, and John Shurtleff, began working on a new show concept called *Heartsongs: Melodies of Love.* Orchestrators and arrangers were commissioned to write for the singers and the 10-piece band. The show concept also called for some original music. Eric Hansen wrote a song celebrating the power of believing in yourself called "Ya Gotta Love You." Former BYU students Ross Boothe, Todd Schwartzman, Taylor Olsen, Nick Day, and Chase Baker also wrote material for the show.

Rehearsals for the BYU Young Ambassadors began in September 2013, and Garrett Breeze from Indiana and Raul Benitez from Paraguay—both commercial music majors in the BYU School of Music—took responsibility for the band arrangements, working with Eric Hansen as their faculty mentor. Raul Benitez said, "I was able to experience firsthand how much work is required to put together a show like the one the Young Ambassadors produce, especially an entirely new one that will be touring the United States and several countries for years. More than anything else I've done during my school years, working with Eric Hansen and Randy Boothe prepared me to jump into a professional career."

Recording a new CD kept the BYU Young Ambassadors hopping during the 2014 winter semester. During the recording sessions, Eric Hansen led the show band, which was split into two groups: the rhythm section and the brass. Logging more than 50 hours in the studio, both groups recorded each of the songs in the show—and the brass recorded everything twice to add depth to the sound by layering. Trombonist David Larson says, "Even though it was a long

recording process, being able to hear yourself playing in the final product is very rewarding, and it makes all the practice time worth it."

Keley Barzeele, who plays keyboard, added, "Recording with the band has been so fun! It's great to see the results of many practice hours and to jam with awesome musicians." Keley also arranged an Oscar Peterson chart for this year's band feature, "Oscar's Boogie."

Ron Saltmarsh, who joined the BYU School of Music faculty in 2011 as division coordinator of the commercial music program, is serving as the producer for the new release. Ron came to BYU from Nashville with a professional recording career that spanned decades. During their undergraduate years at BYU, both Eric Hansen and Ron Saltmarsh performed and toured with the BYU Young Ambassadors as members of the show band. Jordan Roper, a 2013 graduate in Media Music, engineered the project and prepared instrumental mixes for the cast to use during the vocal studio sessions. The large ensemble numbers, which involved the whole cast, required about 12 hours of recording. Recording the smaller groups and solo vocal tracks took another 14 hours. Released on the BYU Records label, *Heartsongs: Melodies of Love* will be an exciting addition to the CD library showcasing the BYU Young Ambassadors' musical legacy.
